Dear Maritime Academy Families,

Welcome to the 2024-2025 school year at The Maritime Academy of Toledo! As we embark on this exciting journey together, I want to extend a warm welcome to all our returning and new families. We are thrilled to have you as part of our school community and are committed to making this year a successful and enriching experience for your child.

Attendance: A Foundation for Success

Regular attendance is crucial for your child's academic success and personal growth. We believe that being present every day helps students stay engaged, build strong study habits, and fully participate in the vibrant learning environment we offer.

- Attendance Policy: Our goal is to have all students attend school daily, arriving on time and prepared for the day ahead. If your child is absent, please notify the school as soon as possible and provide a valid reason for the absence. Consistent attendance is not only important for academic achievement but also for building a strong sense of responsibility and discipline. Teachers cannot maintain consistent procedures, in their classrooms, if students have inconsistent attendance.
- Chronic Absenteeism: We closely monitor attendance and will work with families to address any issues that may lead to chronic absenteeism. If your child accumulates an excessive number of absences, we will reach out to you to develop a plan to improve attendance.
- Excessive Absences: The State of Ohio considers 2 missed days of school a month to be excessive which equates to 18 missed days or 117 hours of lost instruction.

<u>Please Note:</u> In 2022, 74% of eighth graders (nationally) were not proficient in math due to the loss of instructional time during the pandemic. This directly correlates with an adolescent's inability to substitute in-person learning, with a trained teacher, for online learning. In addition, students who attend school regularly have significantly higher graduation rates followed by higher yearly income rates.

Uniforms: Fostering Unity and School Pride

Our school uniform is a symbol of our collective identity and commitment to excellence. It reflects the pride we take in being part of The Maritime Academy community. The last several years Maritime school leadership has not placed an emphasis on our students wearing their

uniforms properly because of other priorities. This is no longer applicable as students are expected to be in uniform every school day.

- Uniform Requirements: Students are required to wear their official Maritime Academy uniforms every day. This includes the designated T-Shirt, appropriate pants or skirts, and closed-toe shoes. Please refer to the uniform policy for detailed guidelines.
- Uniform Compliance: We will conduct daily uniform checks to ensure all students adhere to the dress code. Wearing the uniform correctly helps foster a sense of belonging and equality among our students.
- **Assistance Available**: If you need assistance in obtaining uniforms, please don't hesitate to contact the Helm. We are committed to ensuring every student has the necessary attire to fully participate in school life.
